the state of oregon has just released a preliminary cut list of what might happen if measures 66 and 67 fail on january 26th, 2010.

their cut list includes:

- ∴ closure of support services brokerages
on 01.01.2011
- ∴ elimination of the fairview housing trust fund
- ∴ elimination of funding for developmental disabilities employment and community inclusion programs
- ∴ elimination of transportation services
- ∴ 10% reduction in rates for providers who perform residential supports for adults with developmental disabilities
